TAKING THE CITIES

An inspiring example in Acts 19.

Three levels of confrontation

1. Terrestrial level – verses 11-12

It's the most visible form of confrontation and at times the most

amusing and frightening but it's not the deciding factor.

2. Hidden level - verse 19

You have to see the occult and the evil works.

3. Strategic level - verse 27

The devil moves the pieces intentionally.

How Satan works

In two areas -

- Personal (in people)
- Territorial (in territories)

We have to learn to look at our cities with the eyes of God. We have to ask how Jesus sees our cities.

Obviously we will need the right perspective (Luke 19:42). Along the same lines, we have to think that nobody should know our cities as well as we do.

Things to take into account when planning a strategy for war:

- What the Spirit is saying to the church.
- What territory you want to affect.
- What there is in this territory (other churches, the population, how many blocks, background of the area, plans etc.)
- Communicate with the body of Christ in this area starting with the leaders.
- An investigation into the history.
- A clear revelation of the Spirit.

Intercession

For a while now, God has been teaching His church in this country with regard to this subject. Since the beginning of this process, we have always believed that there is nothing more effective than praying in the places where the things occurred or that are the object of our intercession. Therefore, there is no better intercession for the lost than that which is done with the lost.

Saturate the city with prayer –

- Walks to bless the city.
- Declaration against powers.
- Infiltration of the light.
